# 2016 SATs Results

You will no doubt be aware of the significant changes in the Y6 SATs this year. Our Year 6 children worked hard throughout the year, with the following results being achieved.

Percentage achieving expected standard in reading, writing and mathematics: 52%

Percentage of pupils achieving a high level of attainment in reading, writing and mathematics: 7%

Average progress in reading: -1.5

Average progress in writing: 2.4

Average progress in mathematics: -1.3

Average scaled score in reading: 101

Average scaled score in mathematics: 101

Nationally, 53% reached the expected standard, and 5% achieved a high level. This is very similar to our children's achievements.

We are now focused on building on these results, ensuring that all our children continue to progress well in all subjects.

# Harvest Assemblies

With the growth of the school, and the popularity of our Harvest Assembly for parents, we have decided that we will hold 2 Harvest Assemblies this year, to enable all who wish to attend to do so.

They will be held on 6<sup>th</sup> October, with Y3/4 at 10am, and Y5/6 at 11.15am.

## Trees and Toilets

You may have noticed that one of our willow trees was removed during the summer holidays. This was due to it causing much damage to our drainage systems.

We aslo had two sets of children's toilets refurbished. These have been well received by the children.

#### **Break-Times**

Children may bring a healthy snack (fruit or vegetables) for breaktimes on Monday to Thursday.

Sweets, chocolate and crisps are not permitted on these days. Crisps will be acceptable on Fridays. Please remember that a snack should be a small amount and not excessive in size!

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#### **School Dinners**

#### Absences

#### Water Bottles

# Being a School Governor

Eighteen months ago I became a school governor at Priory Junior School.
