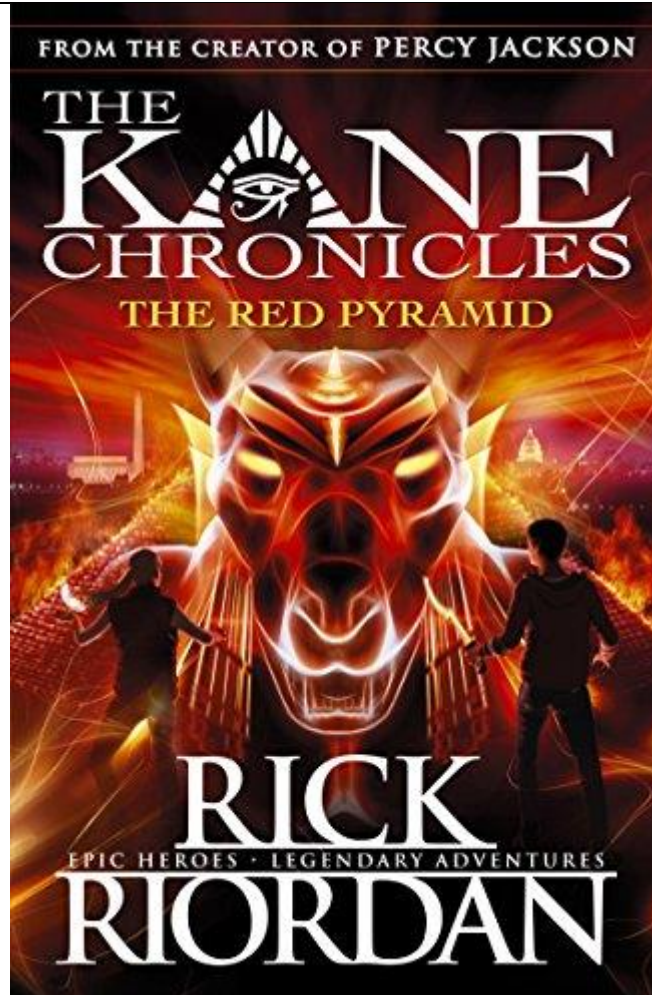
## Ancient Egypt – The Red Pyramid



<b>English</b>		<b>Focus Book: <i>The Red Pyramid</i></b>  This is a fictional story about the Ancient Egyptian gods – it will link to report writing and quest stories. To develop the children's reading, we will be exploring the points of view of different characters at different times throughout the story.  To develop the children's grammar, we will be focusing on fronted adverbials, relative clauses and descriptive techniques such as power of three, similes and metaphors. We will also explore reported and direct speech.	
<b>Maths</b>		In Mathematics, the children's understanding of statistics will be developed. They will also develop their skills and knowledge of shape and geometry. We will be revisiting mental and written methods for all four mathematical operations.	
<b>Science, Geography and History</b>	<b>Science</b>  <b>Key Questions:</b> How are reversible and irreversible changes important to forensic scientists? Which materials dissolve and evaporate and why can this sometimes be an important quality in those materials? How have scientists made use of changes to create materials that make our lives easier? What is bicarbonate of soda and what impact does it have on different materials?	<b>History / Geography</b>  <b>Key Questions:</b> How can we recreate the wonder of the pyramids? Who were the pharaohs and why are they important? What can we learn from the Ancient Egyptians? Where is Egypt and why does it attract tourists from all over the world?	
	<b>Art and Design</b> Design and make an Egyptian mask using paper mache.	<b>Technology</b> Design and make a pyramid with hidden compartments.	<b>Computing</b> Multimedia – record a podcast reporting live from inside Tutankhamun's tomb. Programming – write an algorithm to make a net for a pyramid. Handling data – compare climates between the UK and Egypt and present a weather forecast based on previous data. Creating a lego film animation of the discovery of the tomb of Tutankhamun.
<b>PSHE</b> Financial capability – beginning to learn how to manage money.		<b>RE</b> Stories from the Old Testament: Does God keep His promises? The Stories of Moses and Joseph.	<b>PE</b> Dance: Children create and perform an Egyptian dance. Invasion Games: netball
