2018 SATs Results

We are pleased to share our SATs results from the Summer term. Our Year 6 children worked hard throughout the year, with the following results being achieved.

Nationally, 64% reached the expected standard, and 10% achieved a high level.

We continue to focus on building on these results, ensuring that all our children continue to progress well in all subjects. One of the key aspects of our development work this year will be focused on reading and the development of non-fiction writing.

The only jewellery permitted in school is a watch and stud earrings. Earrings cannot be worn for PE, including newly pierced ears – this is county policy. Earrings are not allowed to be taped over for this purpose.

Please make sure your child is either able to remove their own earrings for PE, or they do not wear them on PE days.

Our new lunches, provided by the Lunchtime Company, are being well-received by children! They have been very excited by the choices on offer, having plates instead of trays, and the placement of jugs of water on the tables. The menus for each week are available to view on the school website, and lunches can be booked and paid for using Gateway. We are happy to say that bookings for birthday tables can now be taken for the week commencing 24th September. Please collect a form from the school office if you wish to book a birthday table. At least four working days' notice is required please.
