#### Free School Meals

At this challenging and uncertain time, we know that families may find themselves in circumstances that have changed, including financial situations.

This may mean that you become eligible to be supported through Free School Meals. You can apply online at www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals

As a school, we have been able to support all families with supermarket food vouchers, if they are eligible for free school meals. Final vouchers for the summer holiday have been arranged.

Once school returns in September, the vouchers will end as children will then receive meals in school.
