# Priory Junior School Accessibility Plan 2019-2022

This Accessibility Policy and Plan are drawn up in compliance with current legislation and requirements as specified in Schedule 10, relating to Disability, of the Equality Act 2010. School Governors are accountable for ensuring the implementation, review and reporting on progress of the Accessibility Plan over a prescribed period.

Our school believes that improving access to education and educational achievement by disabled pupils ensures equality of opportunity, encourages full participation in society, and improves the likelihood of independent living and economic self-sufficiency in the future. We believe that disabled people should be valued for what they can do rather than labelled for what they cannot.

An Accessibility Plan will be drawn up to cover a three year period. The plan will be updated annually.

Our accessibility plan aims to:

- Improve access to the **physical environment** of the school, adding specialist facilities as necessary. This covers improvements to the physical environment of the school and physical aids to access education.
- Increase access to the curriculum for pupils with a disability, expanding the
  curriculum as necessary to ensure that pupils with a disability are as equally
  prepared for life as are nondisabled pupils; (If a school fails to do this they are in
  breach of the DDA). This covers teaching and learning and the wider curriculum of
  the school such as participation in after-school clubs, leisure and cultural activities or
  school visits. It also covers the provision of specialist aids and equipment, which may
  assist these pupils in accessing the curriculum.
- Improve the delivery of **written information** to pupils, staff, parents and visitors with disabilities. Examples might include handouts, timetables, textbooks and information about the school and school events. The information should be made available in various preferred formats within a reasonable time frame.

Attached are Action Plans, relating to these key aspects of accessibility. These plans will be reviewed and adjusted on an annual basis. New Plans will be drawn up every three years.

We acknowledge that there is a need for ongoing awareness raising and training for staff and governors in the matter of disability discrimination and the need to inform attitudes on this matter.

The school will work in partnership with the local authority in developing and implementing this plan and will adopt LA policies and practices when relevant.

The Plan will be monitored by Ofsted as part of their inspection cycle.
