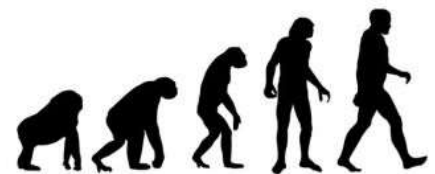

Focus Book: Watertower – Gary Crew

English

This half term we will be reading The Watertower – a short but powerful book shrouded in mystery. We will learn about the genre of suspense and then write our own exciting and dramatic stories. Following that we will look at the subject of writing newspaper reports, using the events in the Watertower to inspire our budding journalists. Finally, we will think hypothetically about what could happen next in the Watertower and in doing so develop our narrative writing skills further.

Maths

In maths we will build on our knowledge of the four operations to understand the order of operations and algebra. We will then go on to explore the differences between long and short division and the most efficient method to use when. Year 6 will explore and learn shape, focusing on area, perimeter and angles. We will also be learning all about fractions, ratio, measures, statistics and applying our maths to a range of investigation and reasoning activities.

Science, Geography and History

Science

Key Questions:

How have living things on Earth changed over time?
Why do we look like we do?
How do animals survive in their environment?
Why is the work of Mary Anning, Charles Darwin and Alfred Wallace important?
How do finches beaks help them eat?
What lives near us and why?

History / Geography

Key Questions:

Why do you think we study the Mayan empire in school?
When the area they lived in was mainly jungle how on earth were the Maya able to grow so strong?
What was life like at the height of the Mayan civilization?
How can we possibly know what it was like there 1,000 years ago?
If the Maya were so civilized, why then did they believe in human sacrifice?
How can we solve the riddle of why the Mayan empire ended so quickly?

Technology

In DT we will be creating our very own kites based on flight in the Rainforest.

Art

The children will be exploring clay-based techniques to create their own Mayan Masks.

Computing

In Computing children will be exploring the e-safety unit 'I am safe'. They will also be creating a non-linear presentation linked to their History unit.

PE

Year 6 will be doing Dance in indoor sessions.
Outside games will consist of invasion games – learning the rules and techniques of team style games.

PSHE

In PSHE the children will be learning about Sex and Relationship education.

RE

The children will be learning about Creation – Can science and religion both be right?

Music

The children be learning all about 'A New Year Carol' - Benjamin Britten and composing their own music to go with a poem.

Languages

French: The children will be exploring French Phonics and then words and phrases about themselves.

Discovery

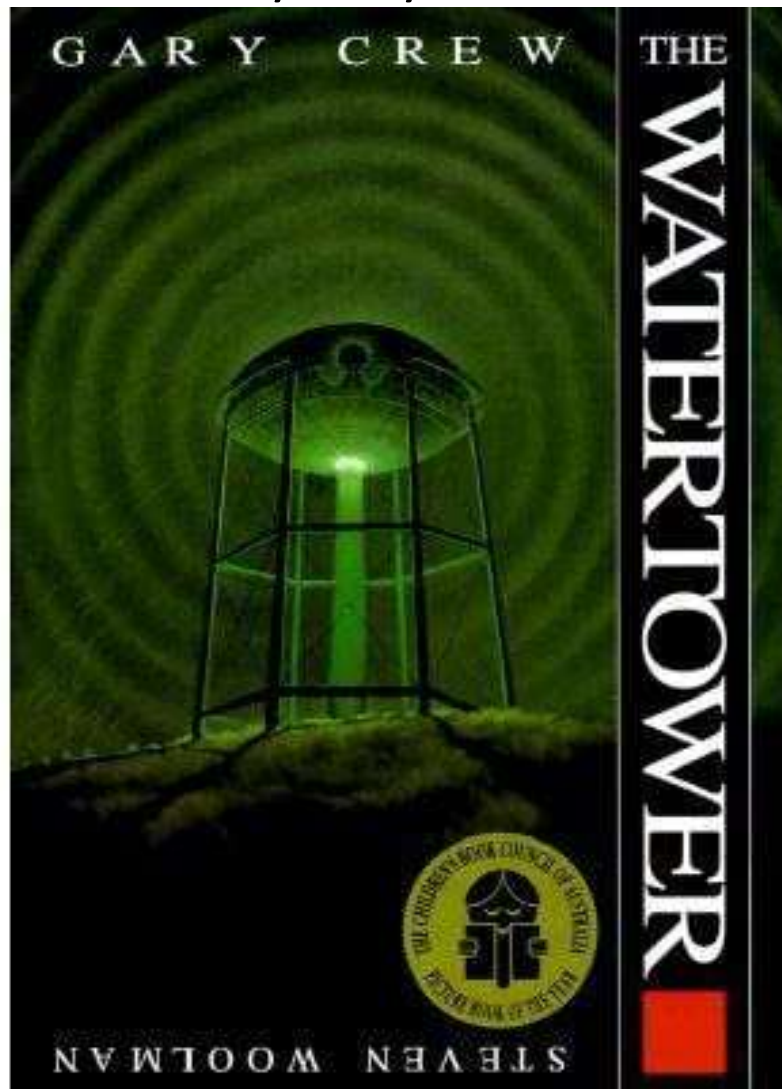
We will investigate the story of the Watertower very closely to find out what was really happening in that mysterious town.
