Parents Drop-Ins - Book an Appointment!

Do you know about our Family Worker? Lorraine Simons, one of the St Neots Locality's Family Workers, visits our school every fortnight and offers **appointments** for parents to support with a wide variety of areas – from bedtime routines – to challenging behaviour. They are also able to provide information to families about other services available in the local area.

If you would like an appointment to see the family worker, this can be done either through the school office, or by calling into the cookery room, when the drop-in sessions are on.

The drop-ins take place on alternate Thursdays, from 8.45 – 10am, and are held in the cookery room.

Emergency Closures

If the school should need to close for any reason, we will notify you through the School Gateway message service, and also on the front page of our website.

We will also notify Cambridgeshire County Council and our local radio station – BBC Radio Cambridgeshire.

Decisions to close the school due to an emergency would always be taken as early as possible, and parents would be informed as quickly as possible regarding this.

New Reading Books

Over the last term, we were very busy replenishing our reading books stock, and also changing from a levelled reading scheme to banded reading book choices. These will allow all children to choose a book from within our library – which is at an appropriate level for their reading.

The children will all be given their band to choose from this week – which will be guided by an initial assessment made in class.

We hope that this will allow all our children to feel motivated and inspired with reading.

We will also be holding a parents information evening on 17th January at 6pm to discuss and explore strategies for supporting children with reading, throughout the junior years.

Parking / Roundabout

Please remember that the roundabout is for dropping off only in the mornings. This is so that we can maintain a steady flow of parents using the roundabout in the morning to drop children off. It works really well when we all keep to this – so please help everyone by making use of the visitor's car park if you wish to leave your car to come onto the playground, or into school.

In the interests of the safety of all our children, please do not park on the zig-zags or the zebra crossing, even for just a short time!

If you are having trouble finding places to park, have you considered 'Park and Stride' – one good place to park for this is Priory Park car park, which the council are happy for you to use for such a purpose, and then walk up to school from there. There are also marked parking bays further up Longsands Road, which are often empty at pick-up time, and are legal places to park.

Autumn Term 100% Attendance

Our attendance for the whole school ended the term at 97%, which is good! 104 children were able to maintain 100% for the Autumn Term too – well done!
