
Year 4 Arid Africa



English

This term the children will be studying the text The Butterfly Lion. We will be using this text to create a discussion text giving arguments for and against lions performing in circuses. The book will encourage children to create their own opinions based on the narrative and it will allow for an interesting debate to take place. It also links to the main topic for this half term as one of the main characters, Bertie, was born in South Africa.

Following this, we will be creating a sequel to the story about the main character in the book, Michael, when he is older. This will give the opportunity for children to use their imaginations and complete some creative writing.

Our guided reading sessions will focus on a range of non-fiction and fiction texts that are all about Africa.

Maths

Linking back to year 3 we will continue to deepen our understanding of time at the start of half term. We will then explore units of measurement and conversion of these measurements to estimate and calculate problems.

The children will then work with discrete and continuous data (graphs) where they will apply their understanding of division and scales. Continuing with measurements, the children will then focus on perimeter at the end of half term.

Throughout this time, the children's learning will be underpinned by the year 3 curriculum to support their development through the year 4 curriculum. We will be using mastery to secure their knowledge and develop a deeper understanding.

PE Dance and Net Games

The children will be doing dance with a focus on the hakka and creating a dance linking to this.

They will also be improving their skills with net games.

PSHE

Children will be learning the difference between rights and responsibilities. The importance of rules and how democratic decisions are made in school.

RE

In R.E. the children will be looking at the **symbolism in light** throughout different religions. This will include the festival of Diwali.

Music

The children will be learning to play the African djembe drums.

Languages French

The children will be learning about the months of the year, body parts, counting up to 31 and clothes.

Aspiration

We will read good examples of discussion texts so we know what we can aspire to.

Responsibility

The children will be responsible for the local environments, including looking at insects and taking care of habitats.

Collaboration

Taking part in rich, collaborative debates to generate ideas for our discussion writing in English.

Perseverance

The children will face challenges as they create their torches and will need to show skills of perserverance to finish making a working torch.

Discovery


The children will be discovering what lives in our local area and how we can further attract wildlife to the area.
