Re: 'Aspirational Me'

We are delighted to announce the launch of Priory's very own 'Aspirational Me'\_Award.

Aspirational Me is a means of recognising your child's achievements both inside and outside of school, and is closely linked to our Priory Junior School Values. It has been developed after consulting with our children, the parents forum and staff at school too.

To receive an award your child will need to have completed a certain number of pledges in all five categories (five of our values):

Motivation Perseverance Collaboration Responsibility Discovery

The pledges to choose from are detailed in the booklet, and you will see that these are linked to school-life and home-life too.

Two pledges in each category achieved will earn their first award – a bronze badge, followed by four to earn silver, and six to earn gold. We will also expect children to demonstrate the remaining five **Priory Junior School Values** in everyday school life too: honesty, courage, thoughtfulness, appreciation and friendship.

Each child at Priory will receive a booklet this week which contains details of the award and the challenges they can select as they strive to achieve a bronze, silver and gold award during this academic year.

Please spend some time with your child reading their booklet and helping them select their future challenges. An adult in school will initial each box when they agree each pledge has been successfully completed and parents can also sign for pledges completed out of school. Children can add details of how they have achieved the pledge too.

Please ensure your child has fully demonstrated that they have achieved each pledge before signing as we want the award to be gained on merit.

Once your child has achieved the number of pledges for each section they should return their











their class teacher who will verify the award so that badges can be presented. Please note that for the 'gold' award parents will be invited to attend the special assembly at which these are awarded.

Children who achieve gold in Year 6 will also become Priory Junior School Ambassadors and receive a blue polo-shirt to wear as part of their school uniform.

I am sure that your child will benefit greatly from working towards their awards and that all of our pupils will benefit from the challenges and goals that they set for themselves. We believe that all children at Priory Junior School can achieve these awards and we are looking forward to a year of celebrating with you all of their personal achievements.
