Parents Drop-Ins – Book an Appointment!

Do you know about our Family Worker? Lorraine Simons, one of the St Neots Locality's Family Workers, visits our school every fortnight and offers **appointments** for parents to support with a wide variety of areas – from bedtime routines – to challenging behaviour. They are also able to provide information to families about other services available in the local area.

If you would like an appointment to see the family worker, this can be done either through the school office, or by calling into the cookery room, when the drop-in sessions are on.

The drop-ins take place on alternate Thursdays, from 8.45 – 10am, and are held in the cookery room.

100 Books Challenge – Check Your Log Book!

Last week, we introduced the children to the 100 books challenge! Leading experts in the field of children's books have recommended a list of 100 books for children in Year 3 and 4 that they should read, and have also done the same for children in Year 5 and 6.

We have introduced the list of books into the children's Log Books – you will find it at the back, along with a space for them to record which ones they have read.

We have also ensured that there is a clear space in the library where these books are stored, and we are encouraging the children to try reading these books too. A special assembly was held to introduce the children to this challenge, and they were enthusiastic about this. Please encourage them to look at the list, choose and record their reading here.

New Caterers / Lunchtime Arrangements

Supervision of Children

From 8.40am, children are supervised coming into the school. Please remember that, before this time, the supervision of children before the start of the day remains your responsibility.

Emergency Closures

If the school should need to close for any reason, we will notify you through the School Gateway message service, and also on the front page of our website.

We will also notify Cambridgeshire County Council and our local radio station – BBC Radio Cambridgeshire.

Decisions to close the school due to an emergency would always be taken as early as possible, and parents would be informed as quickly as possible regarding this.

Tuck Shop / Friday Snacks

We are also excited to be launching a Year 5 Enterprise project this term, in the form of a child-run tuck shop.

Children have applied for roles within our new Tuck Shop business and will be ordering and selling snacks each Friday break-time. A further letter about this will be sent home this week.

All the snacks are healthy choices, with a good range for all to choose from.

We have also given a great deal of consideration to our Friday snacks policy, and as part of being a Health-promoting school, we no longer feel it is appropriate to continue to allow the unhealthy snacks we see being brought in on Fridays. This means from now on, that children should only bring healthy snacks all week, and may bring some money to buy a snack on a Friday too.

Autumn Term Attendance

Our attendance for the whole school ended the term at 97.1%, which is good!

Parking / Roundabout

Please remember that the roundabout is for dropping off only in the mornings. This is so that we can maintain a steady flow of parents using the roundabout in the morning to drop children off. It works really well when we all keep to this – so please help everyone by making use of the visitor's car park if you wish to leave your car to come onto the playground, or into school.

In the interests of the safety of all our children, please do not park on the zig-zags or the zebra crossing, even for just a short time!

If you are having trouble finding places to park, have you considered 'Park and Stride' – one good place to park for this is Priory Park car park, which the council are happy for you to use for such a purpose, and then walk up to school from there. There are also marked parking bays further up Longsands Road, which are often empty at pick-up time, and are legal places to park.

Monday Milers

Have you joined us for the Monday Milers yet? Meeting at 8.30am to do the Daily Mile is a great way to start the week.

Mrs Parker and Mrs Wyer supervise the Daily Mile track at this time each week, with guest appearances each week from other members of staff.

We have also seen some great times from the children this year in our Beat the Adult chart (in our school hall). Well done to all our children who are so enthused with running!
