


Ancient Egyptians



English	<p>As the children missed the Ancient Egyptians topic last year we will be covering this in the first half term. As a result our class text is 'The Egyptian Cinderella'.</p> <p>We will be recreating traditional tales and setting them within Egyptian times and writing a non-fiction text on how to mummify a body!</p> <p>Our guided reading will focus on a range of texts about Ancient Egyptian life.</p>		
Maths	<p>We will be exploring place value including decimal numbers. We will also be familiarising ourselves with written methods and looking at larger numbers up to 7 digits.</p> <p>We will be using procedural and conceptual variation to help become masters at mathematics and applying out knowledge to solve a range of problems.</p>		
Science, Geography and History	<p>Science Key Questions</p> <p>What is gravity? What cupcake case makes the best parachute? What makes the fastest boat? How do I make it stop?!?! Who are Newton and Galileo? Can a small force have a big effect?</p>	<p>History / Geography Ancient Egypt Key Questions:</p> <p>How can we discover what Ancient Egypt was like over 5,000 years ago? Why was the Nile so important? What sources of evidence have survived and how were they discovered? What secrets of Ancient Egypt are revealed by the pyramids? What did the Ancient Egyptians believe about life after death and how do we know? What did Ancient Egypt have in common with other civilizations from that time?</p>	
<p>Art and DT Egyptian Masks and Pyramids The children will design and make an Egyptian mask using papier-mâché and problem solve to design an Egyptian pyramid.</p>		<p>Computing Processing and Presentation We will be using a range of programmes to persuade and inform people of a range of important issues</p>	<p>PE Athletics and Pilates The children will be doing athletics focusing on running, jumping and throwing. They will also be undertaking lessons in pilates.</p>
