

Year 4 English Answers and codes

Piece is the only word which does not have a homophone. There are **five** letters in the word piece.

The first digit of the code is

5



In **six** of these words, the apostrophe to show possession comes after the s. These words are bees', girls', boys', babies', cars' and knives'.

The second digit of the code is

6



Five of these nouns would need the determiner 'an' when used in a noun phrase: **an** apple; **an** umbrella; **an** orange; **an** ice lolly; **an** arrow.

The third digit of the code is

5



Only two words are used which have the **prefix super-**. These are **superstar** and **supermarket**.

The fourth digit of the code is

2



The most commonly used conjunction could be either **but** or **yet**. Both of these conjunctions contain **three** letters.

The fifth digit of the code is

3



Four of these sentences contain a **prepositional phrase**. A prepositional phrase is a phrase which contains a preposition – a word which shows where things are in time or space.

The sixth digit of the code is

4



Only **four** of these words are adverbs: sadly; completely; usually; finally. The rest are adjectives or nouns.

The seventh digit of the code is

4



Five of these words belong in the **vent** word family. They are **prevent, invent, adventure, eventful** and **venture**.

The eighth digit of the code is

5



The answers are 'minute', 'reign', 'island' and 'circle'. The hidden number spelled out in the yellow squares is **nine**.

The ninth digit of the code is

9



Only **one** of these sentences contains correctly punctuated direct speech. The rest are missing inverted commas or end punctuation within the inverted commas.

The tenth digit of the code is

1
