As part of being a governor, you would be expected to:

- Attend governing body meetings there are usually 3 meetings to attend each term some of these
 are being held online currently
- Maintain confidentiality
- Be prepared to attend any training to support with the role: an induction session would be the first training session.
- Take part in visits to the school these are arranged through the governing body meetings and at a mutually convenient time
