

Focus Book: The Tunnel by Anthony Browne

English

This half term the children will be looking at several books by Anthony Browne. There will be a particular focus on the Tunnel. The children will develop their extended writing skills in the style of Anthony Browne. They will implement taught grammar such as: adverbs for cause, place and time; paragraphs and punctuating speech accurately.

In the second part of the half term, the children will be looking at writing a persuasive leaflet to convince people to visit St Neots. This will build on the knowledge which they have developed about St Neots, in particular using the knowledge from the guided trip around the town by the St Neots Museum staff. The children will be taught how to use persuasive techniques such as: rhetorical questions, alliteration and short, impactful sentences.

Maths

Calculation – Children will apply different strategies to subtract efficiently including regrouping the start number in order to make the taking away easier. They will also explore the approach of compensation by taking away 10 and adding one back on when asked to subtract 9. Through looking at fact families, the children will develop their understanding of the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction. When adding, the children will be introduced to formal written methods looking at each place value in turn. Diagrams will continue to be used to deepen the children’s understanding of exchanging ten ones for one lot of ten.

Science, Geography and History

We begin the half term by exploring drawing skills. Children will be drawing humans and animals and looking at Anthony Browne example works

Design Technology

After our Art topic, pupils will be using computer aided design to create a Christmas gift box

Computing

We will be starting to explore Scratch. Children will create their own code to control a character known as a sprite. They will look at the instructions they give the sprite and what it can do.

PE

Dance – The children will be creating different shapes using their bodies and their actions.
 Outdoor - They will be developing their net games skills looking at accurate hitting.

PSHE

We will learn how best to work together. We begin by considering our own and others’ strengths.

RE

The children will be considering what is important to Jewish people.

Perseverance


What barriers might Anthony Browne have faced when becoming a successful author?
