Covid Information

As the lockdown restrictions begin to ease, we absolutely need your support in ensuring that everyone adheres to all of the current measures: 2m distancing; one way systems; wearing a face covering; only being on the school site in the given time slot... all of these will help to reduce the risk of transmission and having to close bubbles.

This is to provide additional security to the building. This will mean that there will be an additional gate at the front entrance path to the school.
