Dear Parents and Carers,

This term, Year 6 are studying Crime and Punishment over 1000 years. One of our lessons focusses on St Neots, looking at the story of John Bellingham. We will be finding out who he was and why he put St Neots on the map.

We have a fantastic opportunity to visit the St. Neots Museum to learn more about this topic. During the session, pupils will be led by a curator. They will be able to visit the prison cells within the museum, as well as completing an object-handling activity where they will experience real and replica items to understand more about life through the ages.

Classes will be visiting the museum on the following days:

AI6 – Monday 27<sup>th</sup> November before lunch

HD6 – Monday 27<sup>th</sup> November after lunch

LP6 – Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> November before lunch

Pupils will need to bring comfortable shoes and a waterproof coat. We will return to school in time for end of the day collection.

There is a charge of £4.00 per child for the trip (the school will pay this charge for those children in receipt of Pupil Premium).

Under the terms of the 1988 Education Act, we are not permitted to make a charge for the visits that take place during school hours, since this breaches the principle of free education. However there is no funding provision to cover these types of activities. To cover these costs, we rely on the continued goodwill of the parents to contribute towards educational visits. We ask you to consider your support of these activities as an important part of your working relationship with us in school.
