We certainly continue to do all we can in school to not only keep the school running efficiently and effectively but also to ensure that everyone is as safe as possible. As you know, your children learn best when they are in school. This is right for the children without a doubt and our contingency plans (where we might ringfence a class) are designed to reduce transmission and keep the school running.

We appreciate that this may happen quite quickly for everyone but thank-you all for your flexibility at this time. ### Journeys to School

Traffic and parking around Longsands Road at the start and the end of the school day continues to be very busy.

The further away from school that you can park, the better. This way, you will keep the area around school safer for all families coming to school.

Mr Shaw is continuing to place cones near to the school entrance as a reminder to everyone that there should be no parking on the zig-zags, or opposite the entrance to the school.

Don't forget to try one of the following:

- Park a little further along Longsands Road and walk the final part of the journey
- If you have a little more time, could you park at Priory Park car park and make use of the traffic-free path up to Longsands Road by Priory Park?
