Face Coverings

Thank-you for all your support with wearing your face covering to school for drop-off and collection. We hope this will enable everyone to be a little more safer when visiting the school site at these busier times.

Absences

If your child is unwell for any reason, please inform the School Office as soon as possible, along with the reason for the absence – this can be done using Pupil Asset or by leaving a message on the telephone system: 01480 226730.

Should your child be experiencing any symptoms related to Covid-19, please do not send them, or their siblings into school unless you have had a negative test. Without this, your child should remain at home for 10 days.

Symptoms are: a new, persistent cough a high temperature or a sudden loss of sense of smell or taste.

Should anyone in your household be experiencing symptoms, your child should not come into school and should self-isolate for 10 days.

Asymptomatic Testing for Families

Undertaking regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing helps reduce transmission of the virus. Parents and other adults in households with children at school or college, who do not have symptoms, can now access regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. This includes childcare and support bubbles.

Tests are fast, easy and completely free. There are <u>different ways</u> for a household, childcare or support bubble to collect their test to take at home, twice-weekly:

through your employer, if they offer testing to employees

by collecting a home test kit from a local test site – anyone aged 18 or over can collect 2 packs of 7 tests by ordering a home test kit online – please do not order online if you can access testing through other routes, this frees up home delivery for those who need it most.

If you have any queries about the tests, and you live in England, please call 119 (free from mobiles and landlines). Lines are open every day from 7am to 11pm.

Children of primary school age (and below) without symptoms are not being asked to take a test.

Testing is voluntary, but strongly recommended to all who are eligible. Alongside the vaccine, washing hands, wearing face coverings, and maintaining social distancing, rapid testing plays a vital role in reducing transmission rates. Getting into the habit of regular testing as part of our everyday lives will help us all to play our part and do what we can to protect each other.
